RELEVANT PROJECTS

Baytown Soccer Complex - Harris County, TX

Bryan served as Project Manager and Landscape Designer for this 150 acre soccer complex located in Baytown, TX, in which Phase I was completed in October 2008. Specific services he has provided include conceptual site master planning, schematic design, construction document production, and on-site construction administration.

Buckboard Park – Houston, TX

Bryan was a Project Designer for this park project. Buckboard Park is located on five acres in the Greenspoint area of Houston. Its completion in 2009 transformed an asphalt parking lot and overgrown parcel of land into a neighborhood park for all ages. Park amenities include a walking trail, play structures, picnic and seating areas, butterfly gardens, and the work of local artists that is both visually and physically stimulating. Artwork includes a giant 40-foot long mosaic caterpillar play structure, an ornamental steel piñata pavilion, and small steel birds and butterflies located along the walking trail.

Carl Barton, Jr. Park - Conroe, TX

Bryan served as Landscape Designer for Phase 4 and 5 of this master planned sports complex. In his current role, Bryan is responsible for the design of four new lighted softball fields, and the design of three new lighted soccer fields. Specific services he has provided include schematic design and presentation graphics, construction document production, along with on-site construction administration.
